We have also sent out creative learning opportunities, which we believe will capture the children's imaginations and allow them to explore topics in more depth. These activities are designed to be engaging and can be completed without the need for screens, as we understand the importance of balancing device time with other forms of learning.

The adjustments we have made aim to reduce the amount of homework that requires the use of devices, reflecting your feedback regarding screen time. We hope this balance allows for not only educational growth but also quality family time.

#### **Snack time**

At Thameside Primary we are a healthy school so can I please remind you of the following: **Foundation and Key Stage 1** children receive a free piece of fruit or portion of vegetables as part of the Government



School Fruit and Vegetable Scheme for their tuck at playtime. **Key Stage 2** children can bring in a healthy snack from home. Healthy snacks could include: fruit, raisins, cheese, vegetables or

yogurt. Please note that grapes need to be cut in half. Also children should have a fresh bottle of water in school every day. Bottles should be taken home each day to be cleaned and refilled. Facilities are available in school where children can refill them at lunchtime and playtimes.

### **Year 6 Applications for Secondary School**

If your child was born between 1 September 2013 and 31 August 2014 you must apply for their secondary school place between 1 September 2024 and 31 October 2024. Applications received after the closing date are treated as late applications. This means there will be far less chance of your child being offered a place at the school you want. We also re-created Galileo Galilei's scientific discovery by dropping two identically shaped spheres of different masses to prove that objects of the same shape accelerate towards the Earth at the same rate. We really enjoyed our practical Science investigation.
