While it has been a challenge for our teachers to adapt to this new method, we're thrilled with the impact it's having on our students so far.

Finally, a quick reminder to all parents: please ensure that your child brings a coat to school every day. Unless it's pouring with rain, we like to get the children outside for a run around and some fresh air during break and lunchtime.

Footsteps 2 This week in Art the children made some Bell Beaker designs on clay.



Punctuality

It is very important that all children arrive on time. School doors open at 8.40am every morning. If your child arrives after 8.50am then they are late and they will not be able to come into school via the usual morning entrance doors but should instead come through the main school entrance. Your child will then need to sign in using our electronic signing in system. We will then be able amend the registers and ensure your child is marked for a school dinner.

Please note that if your children arrive at school later than 9.20am, we are required to mark them as absent for that half day session.


