This week our Reception parents came into school for a phonics workshop led by our Early Years lead


(Mrs Hurley) and Deputy Head Teacher (Miss Caton).

Year 1 have been recognising and naming 3D shapes. We went on a shape hunt around the school to find different 3D shapes.




Year 5
